1.	How will general learning and teaching activities be delivered in Semester Two of 2021/22?		
2.	What are essential face-to-face learning and teaching activities?	Essential face-to-face learning and teaching activities usually refer to the practice-based activities, such as practicums, clinical skills training, hands - on laboratory sessions, placements, trainings, studio sessions and field studies. They are defined as essential and mandatory by Faculties/Departments to meet professional accreditation or programme graduation requirements.	
3.	How will essential face-to-face learning and teaching activities be conducted?	Arrangements for essential learning and teaching activities as deemed mandatory by Faculties/Departments, will be decided by subject offering departments in achieving the intended learning outcomes. They may conduct these essential activities online, switch to small groups with appropriate social distancing and protection measures, offer make-up sessions or defer these activities. Subject offering departments will advise students of the arrangements separately.

4.	I am currently residing outside Hong Kong. Am I required to return to Hong Kong in Semester Two of 2021/22?	Until the end of Semester Two, all general learning and teaching activities, e.g. lectures, tutorials, etc., will be conducted via the online mode only, using Blackboard Collaborate Ultra, MS Teams, or Zoom as appropriate. All lectures, seminars and tutorials will be videotaped and uploaded to the Learning Management System (LMS) for students' reference and revision. Students who are currently residing outside Hong Kong can continue learning through online teaching.
5.	Will the University make special arrangements (e.g. accommodation associated with quarantine) for students currently residing outside Hong Kong who have the needs to return to Hong Kong?	You will have to make advance arrangements to meet the HKSAR Government's boarding and quarantine requirements (e.g. travel and accommodation arrangements). Please refer to the latest guidelines released by the HKSAR Government via https://www.coronavirus.gov.hk/eng/index.html . The Non-local Student Services Team under the Student Affairs Office will be providing you support on issues which you need to know or follow when entering Hong Kong. (C)	Assessment Arrangements	
6.	How will continuous assessments and examinations be conducted?	Subjects originally planning to conduct on-campus examinations will adopt alternative assessment arrangements, such as online invigilated examinations, take-home examinations, or 100% continuous assessment. For a few subjects that require on-campus examinations due to pedagogical needs or accreditation requirements, the conduct of on-campus examinations will normally be deferred to the examination period of Summer Term of 2021/22. Please refer to the updated format of end-of-semester assessment for individual subjects via this link . Subject offering departments, by the end of February 2022, have also advised students separately of the assessment details, e.g. the arrangement of mock-run with students in the case of online invigilated examinations.
7.	How will subject teachers help me improve my learning more effectively?	Subject teachers will provide students with the assessment rubrics at the beginning of the semester and give timely feedback on students' assessed work, well before the end of teaching.

8.	What learning resources and services are provided by the Library?	Additional e-resources such as e-journals, e-books, e-databases and online videos have been acquired to support learning. Students may also easily find their course readings on the Resource List platform. The Library continues to support students' research needs through library workshops such as "Citing References and Avoiding Plagiarism" and "Citation Databases – Web of Science and Scopus". In addition, the Library offers three interactive online courses specially designed for Undergraduate and Postgraduate students. Should students require in-depth assistance on specific resources, they can continue to request for a research consultation with their Faculty Librarians. 9.	What is the arrangement for service-learning activities, which is a graduation requirement for all undergraduate students?	We have been living with the pandemic for over two years and service-learning subjects have continued to operate during this time. However, obviously the service-learning projects need to accommodate the social distancing measures and keep both you and the community safe. Your service-learning subject teacher will have more details — check with them and do make sure that you read all the relevant emails and announcements on Blackboard. 10.	Will outbound service-learning projects be resumed in Summer 2022?	We would definitely like to resume outbound service-learning projects. We know that they are beneficial to students' learning and we can also bring a lot of help to the communities. That said, outbound service-learning projects are challenging to coordinate and a lot of logistics are involved. The service projects and service sites are very different and the way that they handle the COVID situation (i.e. quarantine, etc.) is also quite different. Some of the service sites may not have their COVID situation fully under control or adequate medical facilities. In other words, while we would like to resume our outbound projects, we also need to ensure that staff and students are kept safe and healthy, and there is no one-size-fits-all solution. We are studying each of the project sites carefully with your service-learning subject teachers. We may not be able to get all the outbound projects going in Summer 2022 yet. Your service-learning subject teacher will have the details.
