Prof. Chan Ka Kui, BBS, JP qualified as a Chartered Quantity Surveyor in 1974. He has excelled himself in the last forty years in the construction industry and public services. He was elected as the Chairman of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors (Hong Kong Branch) in 1989, Chairman of the Construction Industry Training Authority from 1993 to 2001 and was the Vice President of the Hong Kong Construction Association from 1989 to 1999.

Prof. Chan has a wide spectrum of interest and expertise. His contribution to Hong Kong is not merely restricted to the surveying profession and construction industry. He was appointed by the government to serve as Chairman of the Sir David Trench Fund Committee, Vice Chairman of the Occupational Safety and Health Council and member of both the Town Planning Board and the Sports Development Board.

Prof. Chan retired from employment in 2008 to focus on his interest in community services. He is currently the Chairman of the Mustard Seed Foundation which is a charitable foundation aiming to help young people from underprivileged families, Chairman of Friends of Caritas and a member of various government committees. He was Chairman of the Advisory Committee of the BRE Department from 2009 to 2013 and a recipient of the Outstanding BRE Alumni Award 2014.
