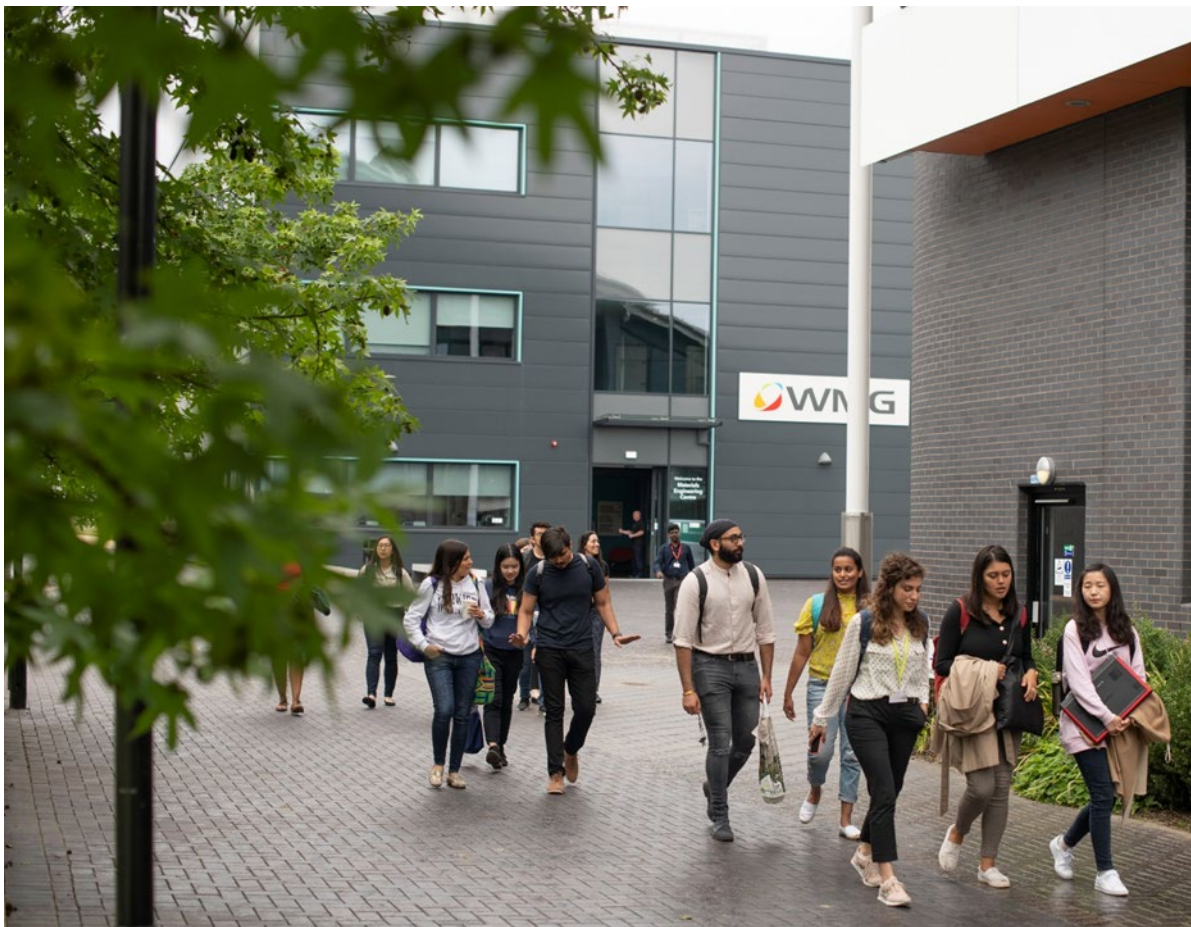


## *Introduction to the University of Warwick*

## ***1.2 Enrolment***

Before you start in your course you must enrol with the University of Warwick via: <http://go.warwick.ac.uk/enrolment> which must be done before attending any modules. Part of enrolment will also include registering for your Warwick IT and email account, which will allow you access to the University's online facilities including the WMG Student Portal, the Library and other University systems needed for you module attendance and assessment submission.

Enrolling requires you to accept the University's regulations and codes of conduct. Please note that data about you will be held on the University's central student record system in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation 2018. The data you provide enables the University to keep track of you throughout your academic career and to ensure that you are correctly issued with a certificate upon successful completion of your course.

- **Warwick IT card:** If you attend any modules at the University of Warwick's main UK campus, you will need to collect a student ID card in order to gain entry to the buildings.
