
This programme equips executives with the capacity to create and sustain competitiveness in the supply chain by balancing cost, quality and efficiency.



Professional Recognition

- Graduates with the MSc in Global Supply Chain Management having fulfilled certain subject requirements are granted accreditation by The Chartered Institute of Procurement & Supply (CIPS) and may apply for full membership. (Subject to review each year)
- Graduates with the MSc in Global Supply Chain Management are granted full exemption from the Qualifying Examination of The Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport in Hong Kong (CILTHK).
- Graduates with the PgD in Global Supply Chain Management are granted partial exemption from the Qualifying Examination of The Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport in Hong Kong (CILTHK).
- Graduates with the MSc in Global Supply Chain Management and 2-year working experience in Purchasing/ Supply Chain/ Logistics or related fields may apply for full membership of The Institute of Purchasing & Supply of Hong Kong (IPSHK).
- Students who complete one or more relevant subjects in MSc in Global Supply Chain Management are eligible to apply for the following qualifications provided by the Six Sigma Institute (SSI):
 - Registered Lean Six Sigma Green Belt (RLSSGB)
 - Registered Six Sigma Green Belt (RSSGB) and Registered Lean Leader (RLL)
 - · Lean Six Sigma Black Belt Certificate

Structure (subject to review)

For MSc

31 credits (4 Compulsory Subjects + 3 Restricted Elective Subjects + 4 Free Elective Subjects)

For PgD

19 credits (4 Compulsory Subjects + 3 Restricted Elective Subjects)

Tuition fee is not required for the 1-credit subject "Academic Integrity and Ethics in Business". Each subject carries three credits while GSCM Project carries six credits.

Compulsory Subject

(4 subjects – 10 credits) (for both MSc and PgD) +

- Academic Integrity and Ethics in Business (1 credit)
- Global Sourcing and Supply *
- International Logistics Systems, Operations and Management *
- Supply Chain Management *

Restricted Elective Subjects

(3 subjects – 9 credits) (for both MSc and PgD) +

Choose at least one from the focus on Operations:

- International Operations Management *
- Managing Operations Systems

Choose at least one from the focus on Procurement:

- Contract Management *
- Digital Procurement Management and Analytics *

Choose at least one from the focus on Information Technology:

- E-Commerce *
- Information Systems for Supply Chain Management *

Students may take more Restricted Elective Subjects than required. The extras will be counted as Free Elective Subjects.

The programme (MSc in Global Supply Chain Management) is recognized under the Qualifications Framework (QF Level 6).

Mode of study: Mixed-mode

Students can pursue their studies in either a full-time study load (taking 9 credits or more in a semester) or a part-time study load (taking less than 9 credits in a semester). In general, **one evening class** per week will be scheduled for each subject over a regular 13-week semester and **two evening classes** per week over a 7-week optional Summer Term.

Duration (subject to review)

For MSc

Part-time mode: two and a half (2.5) academic years including optional summer terms Full-time mode: one and a half (1.5) academic years including an optional summer term

For PgD

Part-time mode: two and a half (2.5) academic years including optional summer terms Full-time mode: one and a half (1.5) academic years including an optional summer term

Students can complete the programme in one (1) year in Full-time mode according to their own study pace.

Students who wish to extend their studies beyond normal duration can submit such request to the Department of Logistics and Maritime Studies for consideration.

Scholarships

LMS Taught Postgraduate Programme Scholarship Scheme

- Merit-based scholarship of HK\$50,000 for each recipient
- Around 20% of our students will be awarded (subject to review)

Entrance Requirements

- A Bachelor's degree in a business-related discipline or the equivalent.
- For non-business degree holders, 2-year relevant working experience or relevant background knowledge is preferred.
- Candidates in senior management positions possessing other academic qualifications may be considered on a case-by-case basis.
- Priority will be given to applicants with relevant working experience.

If you are not a native speaker of English, and your Bachelor's degree or equivalent qualification is awarded by institutions where the medium of instruction is not English, you are expected to fulfil the University's minimum English language requirement for admission purpose. Shortlisted candidates may be invited to attend admission interviews.
