Scenario:

Mary goes to **Germany** for **one-semester exchange** and she has never applied for Government Subsidy during the whole undergraduate study.

She received 25% government grant from SFO for her study during Academic Year 2024/25.

Her subsidy amount will be: $(8,000 + 25,000) \times 50\% = \$16,500$

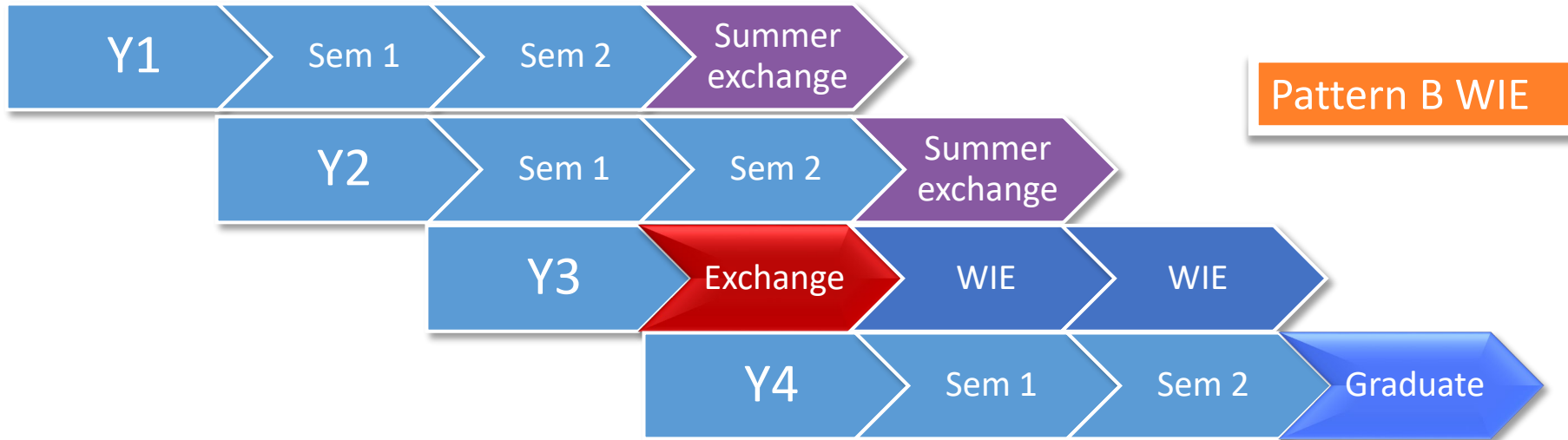
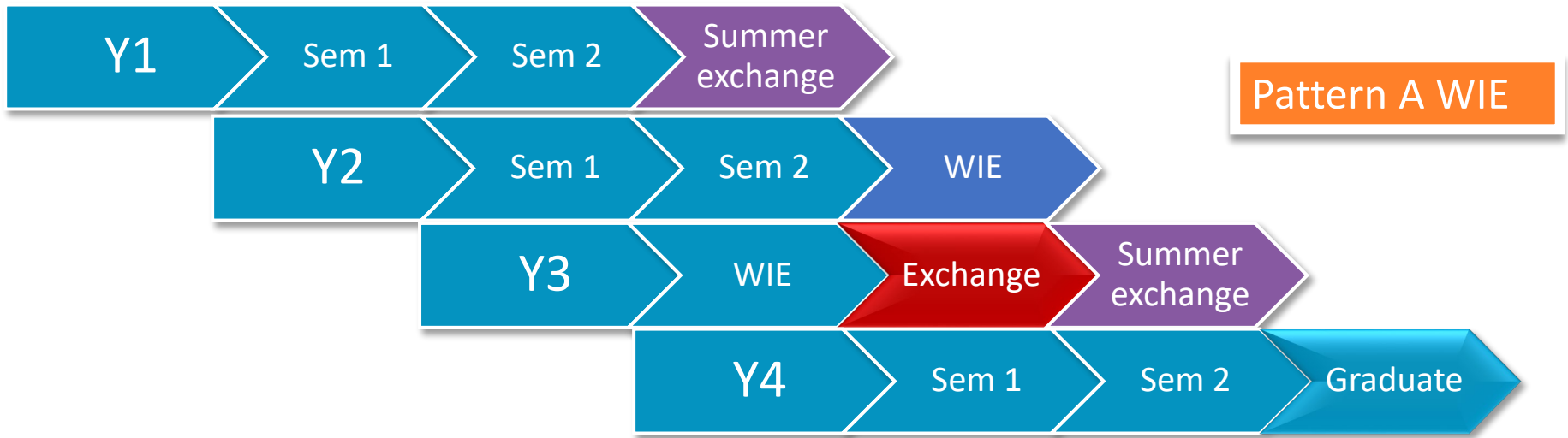

Credit Requirements for Graduation	: 124 (students taking a minor) or 121 (students taking free electives) academic credits, plus 7 training credits (6 training credits of Work-Integrated Education (WIE), and 1 training credit of Professional Development.)
Requirement for General University Requirements (GUR)	: To fulfil the Requirement for General University Requirements (GUR), students are required to complete 30 credits in GUR subjects.
China Studies Requirement (CSR)	: A minimum of 3 credits on any subjects designated as "China-related" subjects should be chosen from the 4 cluster areas to fulfil the China-Studies Requirement (CSR). China-related subjects can also contribute to CSR.
Discipline Specific Requirement (DSR)	: Students have to complete 76 credits to fulfil the Major study (DSR) requirement.
Overall English and Chinese Language Requirement	: <u>Language and Communication Requirement (LCR)</u> The Language and Communication Requirement (LCR) consists of two 3-credit English language subjects and one 3-credit Chinese language subject. Students who are weaker linguistically are required to take a further one or two credit-bearing language enhanced subjects. Students' language level upon entry will be assessed with reference to their overall and sub-score on the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (HKDSE). Separate arrangements will be made to assess those students who have not taken the HKDSE. <u>Writing Requirement (W)</u> Students are required to pass one subject that includes a requirement for a substantial piece of writing in English and one subject with a requirement for a substantial piece of writing in Chinese among those taken within the Cluster Area Requirement (CAR). <u>Reading Requirement (R)</u> Students are required to pass one subject that includes a requirement for reading of an extensive text in English and one subject with a requirement for reading of an extensive text in Chinese among those taken within the Cluster Area Requirement (CAR). <u>Discipline Specific Language Requirement</u> Students are required to take at least two 2-credit subjects in DSR in which students are required to do a significant assignment using language in a disciplinary setting. One of these courses would involve English while the other would involve Chinese. These subjects would include a substantial assessed product, in spoken or written form, that would be assessed for the appropriateness and accuracy of the language used.
CHIA Professional Course Requirement	: Hotel Management Students are required to fulfill the Certification in Hotel Industry Analytics (CHIA) as a compulsory graduation requirement
