SN-the biggest winner in Faculty Awards

The School scoops **ALL** Faculty Awards in the Faculty of Health and Social Sciences (FHSS) Awards/Prizes for outstanding achievement 2019/20.

At the end of July, the FHSS announced the winners of the awards/prizes. The **Faculty Award in Teaching** goes to the School's Massive Open Online Course (MOOC) team. The team has developed three courses in edX: Human Anatomy; Frailty In Daily Living; and Shared Decision Making and Interprofessional Collaboration in Health Care. All courses recorded high enrollments with totally over 140,000 global learners. Our courses were recommended as a 'skill' course for career success and a 'must take'course [by edX], and one of the ten awesome science courses that is free to take online [by an American organisation].

The Faculty Award in Teaching is a recognition of the efforts paid by the MOOC team in using innovative strategies in promoting health care learning. This is also the second time **Dr John Yuen** is selected for receiving this team award.

A big applause to **Dr Lin Yang**, who is the first-ever SN staff member receiving the **Faculty Award in Research and Scholarly Activities.** Dr Yang has conducted a series of high-impact research studies on infectious disease epidemiology and infection control. To date, she has published 27 research articles on the novel coronavirus disease (COVID-19) in international peer-reviewed journals.

Members of the Squina International Centre for Infection Control (CIC) capture the **Faculty Award in Services**. Team leader **Dr Lorna Suen** contributed the receiving of the award to their all-round responses to the COVID-19 outbreak. For example, the team has set up a video library of best practices in infection control, developed guidelines for health and safety, provided advice on best mask brands for sourcing and bulk purchase. Thei expertise has reached the PolyU community, as well as local NGOs, the general public, and even to the healthcare workers in Mainland China (such as those in Wuhan and Sichuan). The PolyU-Henry G. Leong Mobile Integrative Health Centre, led by Dr Thomas Choi, received the same award five years ago.

Interdisciplinary project to prevent and intervene elder abuse

Led by Dr Elsie Yan (Associate Head, Department of Applied Social Sciences) and **Prof. Frances Wong**, the Co-Principal Investigator, an interdisciplinary research team has been formed for conducting a study on collaborative efforts in detecting, preventing and intervening elder abuse cases in Hong Kong.

Spearheaded by the Faculty of Health and Social Sciences and supported by the Lee Hysan Foundation, this research study is going to be launched next year. The study aims to create the first evidence-based protocol for detecting, preventing and intervening in cases of elder abuse and develop a set of screening tools, a practice manual and training procedures for handling and managing of elder abuse cases.

Seminars on cultural awareness in research process

From 24 February to 20 April, members of the HK team of the Internationalization@Home project (I@H), including **Dr E Angela Chan, Dr Doris Leung, Ms Bessie Chan** and **Dr Betty Chung**, together with their international partners delivered a series of five webinars. One of which was titled 'Culture in the Research Process' held on 23 March.

Initiated by the School and the University of Malmo, Sweden, in 2014, I@H aims to connect international academics, researchers, and postgraduate students to develop inter-professional learning modules about cultural awareness in Social Science and Healthcare Education.

La Trobe University, Australia, has joined the project and the module has been introduced in their Health Sciences programme. The National University of Ireland, Galway, is planning to introduce the module in their health and social science disciplines of Medicine and Nursing next year.

Since its launch, the I@H has produced seven international-peer reviewed research publications and numerous abstracts, which were accepted for conference presentations and focused on topics about cultural competency in research and education.

Members supported Bangladesh in combating COVID-19

An online meeting was held on 7 May to discuss how to support Bangladesh in combating COVID-19. **Ms Phyllis Pang, Dr Patrick Kor and Mr Oscar Chung** shared the experience of Hong Kong in infection control, quarantine, and implementing preventive measures.

A network was established currently for knowledge and experience exchange among members for combating COVID-19. It consists of Dr Zarina Nahar Kabir (Associate Professor of Public Health, Division of Nursing, Department of Neurobiology, Care Sciences and Society, Karolinska Institute), Dr Uzzal Kumar Roy (General Manager, SAJIDA Foundation, Bangladesh), Dr Shangjucta Das Pooja (Senior Coordinator, Quality Control-Disaster Response Unit, SAJIDA Foundation, Bangladesh), and the representatives of the School.

Member serves as Project Reviewer of CDC's division

Dr Simon Lam has been invited by the Division of Field Studies and Engineering, the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) of Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the United States, to serve as an external reviewer of a new research project titled 'PPE Availability and Mental Health Outcomes in a Healthcare Worker Cohort', which will address occupational safety and health issues related to COVID- 19.

This invitation came after the results of Dr Lam's study on particle filtration efficiency (PFE) of face masks was published in the *American Journal of Infection Control* (Click here to read the full text). Commissioned as Lead Consultant by Fugro Technical Services Ltd*, Dr Lam has been estimating PFE of face masks, based on samples of 160 brands from different sources and countries. The test was conducted by using CIC's self-established system (including two optical aerosol spectrometers).

The result showed that about 43% of the tested face masks demonstrated insufficient filtration performance at 0.3 µm. The findings attracted extensive media attention locally. In April, Dr Lam was interviewed by News Magazine of TVB in which he talked about different types of personal protective equipment (PPE) and its donning and doffing. Another interview by Hong Kong Economic Times about the particle filtration efficiency and quality of adult and children masks attracted over 160K views (as on 5 June). Locally, in July, Dr Lam has also been appointed as Honorary Advisor to Haven of Hope Sister Annie Skau Holistic Care Centre for advising on matters relating to infection control and end-of-life care.
