## Developments in upgrading of learning space

Video capture studio and editing room with technical support in Z106

The Video Capture and Editing Facility@PolyU can be found at Z106a/b (Phase 8 building 1<sup>st</sup> floor), and is now in operation.

#### Aim:

To provide a custom made and well equipped space with technical support to facilitate production of educational videos for teaching staff at PolyU.

### The videos can be for:

- Your own personal practice and self-reflection on teaching
- Inclusion in your evidence-based teaching portfolio
- Video clips for blended and on-line learning
- Lecture capture for preparation of stand-in and make-up classes
- Production of MOOCs

### Some of the reasons you might like to use it:

- Prepare content to free up class time for more interactive learning
- Prepare introductory and revision materials that students can use and reuse via Blackboard
- Review and develop presentation skills
- Build capacity and prepare materials for on-line teaching & MOOC building
- Facilitate teaching cover for staff who are away
- Facilitate off campus learning
- Provide a resource bank for new teachers
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#### Features:

- Video capture room: cameras, lights, different style backdrops, green screen, voice recording equipment, teleprompting system, 72" monitor, internet access
- Post-production editing room: with PCs and specialized software
- Expert technical support for filming and editing: Mr. Andrew Tsang
- 'Mobile' video service is under planning.

## Creation of a mobile technology, collaborative learning zone in Z105/06

An unique learning space, 'THE ZONE' featuring up to 12 Mobile Collaboration Multimedia 'stations' or 'learning pods' will be created in Z105/106 over the summer, each with a mobile computer on wheels, keyboard and monitor on a tailor made trolley (a MoCoW), table and chairs to accommodate 6-8 people and two writing panels. Stations will be able to be booked by students and staff for interactive tutorials, group work, collaborative learning, and THE ZONE will also offer a unique space for technology-assisted workshops. It will be open for use in Semester I, 2015/16.

# Upgrading of general classrooms and lecture theatres

Based on visual inspection and feedback from the staff and student surveys, 13 rooms have been identified as priority areas, and these have been approved for 'renewal' in two phases in 2015 and 2016. The upgrade of the first batch of general classrooms and lecture theatres (TU101, TU103, TU107, TU201, U208 and BC TEIC room) will start in summer 2015. Over the summer 2015 they will be renewed and revitalized into modern technology enhanced rooms that are designed to facilitate interactive, more student-centred learning. The rooms will be in use in Semester 1, 2015/16.

## New nodal chairs in QR611

QR611 was transformed from a computer laboratory into a 45 capacity General Teaching room which features a new look and more modern facilities and furniture. The upgraded room was used for teaching starting from semester 1 of 2014-15, and a user survey (staff and students) was performed. The feedback is largely positive, but students have not found the chairs very comfortable - so, in response, nodal chairs (shown below) in orange & white will replace the existing chairs over the summer period, ready for semester 1 of 2015-16.



# Identifying other suitable and underused spaces on campus to create more informal learning spaces

We are now looking for spaces at PolyU that are currently underused, unused or unusable, such as corridor-ends, stairwells, open spaces, dead ends (inside and outside) that can be transformed into informal, collaborative learning spaces equipped with simple furniture, electric sockets no device but wifi enabled for students on main campus. We will try our best to seek funding support from the university to cover the costs of the enhancement/renovation of the spaces. Classrooms and lecture theatres in PolyU are undergoing refurbishment/remodelling and will feature new generation and 'integrated' IT/AV facilities and tools, as well as improved physical space. The higher level of technology (both in hardware and software) and the design, furniture and layout in our revitalized learning spaces will facilitate the use of blended learning, video capture and use of video in class, promote more student interaction, and support you in 'flipping; your classroom. The enhanced level of technology and the integrated nature of many AV/IT tools can be described as our 'digital learning environment'.

To help identify teachers' needs for training and other forms of learning support, we are planning to seek teachers' views and to explore their expected or anticipated needs on the upgraded digital learning environment, as well as support services they will need so that blended and online and innovative learning and teaching (L&T) at PolyU can develop and thrive.
